



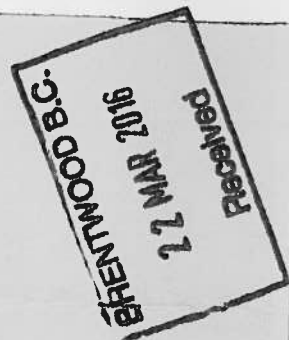

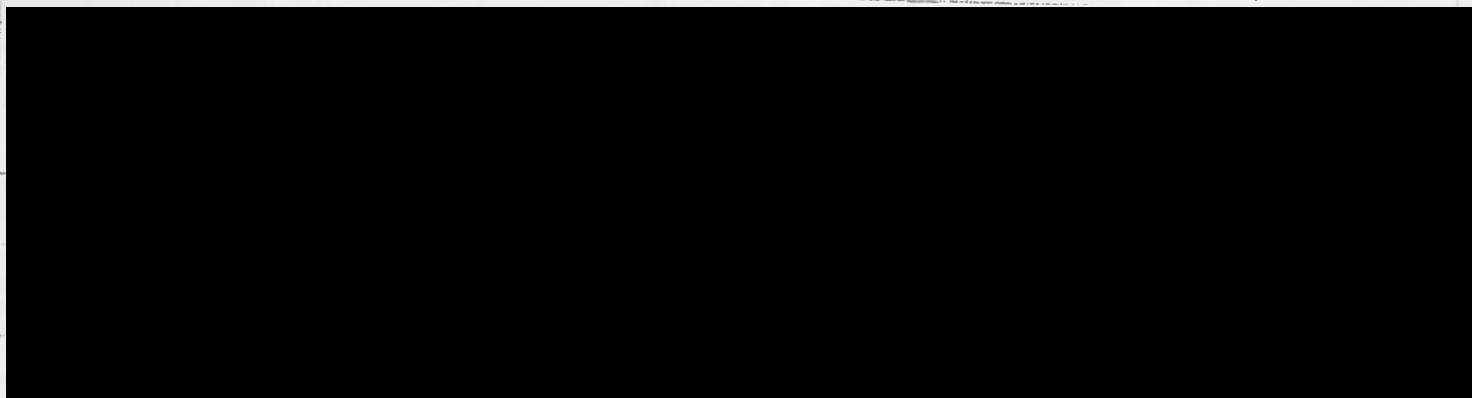

I feel that developing so much south of the Bolongh is unjustified — the cost of building 2,500 homes and associated infrastructure will be immense! Brentwood centre and north along the A12 corridor has much better links to transport and schools, shops, GP's etc. They are already in place and with Crossrail coming to Sheffield will be even better! Why build 3/4 of the homes required south of the Bolongh where there are fewer schools, shops, GP's etc. Doesn't make sense — there is land available along the A12 corridor to develop. Why is it thought that the landscape along the A127 Corridor is less appealing than that along the A12 ???? what absolute nonsense. West Holndon has softened in its view to have 500 homes on the industrial estate BUT we must have facilities to cope with the extra homes!! We have seen no further plans of how this will happen. I agree new homes need to be built but surely it's not a good idea to do so on Greenbelt land that is so precious to the wellbeing of us all. Further sight of plans (more detailed & necessary) — A smaller development at Dunton would be a far more viable option and less destructive. You need to think again and look further north and STOP P.T.O
