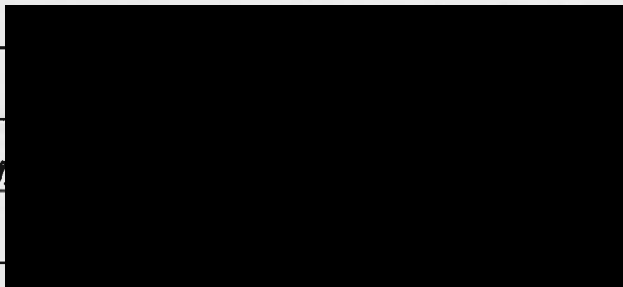

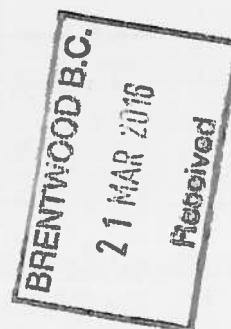
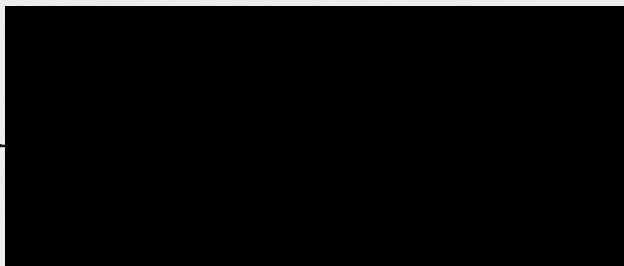

# DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

When in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. — That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, — That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness.

Prudence, in the second place, will not forbid that should a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing the same object, render a Paper of Rights necessary, it is the duty of those who are called upon to attend to their Country with a view to its Liberty, to support them by a unanimous Declaration of the Sentiments upon which alone they can be supported, and in which alone they are to be justified.

And as a Declaration of Sentiments is a solemn Appeal to the Great Ruler of the Universe, it is reasonable and just that we should submit a List of the wrongs, to which we have been subjected, and which we claim as the Grounds and Reasons of our Declaration.

In the 12th month of the year 1776, we the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress assembled, do hereby declare, that these United States are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States; that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connections with Great Britain are hereby totally dissolved.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our hands and seals, the 4th day of July, 1776.

ENGLANDS GREEN BELT IS DESIGNED TO PREVENT URBAN SPRAWL BY KEEPING THE AREAS OPEN AND FREE FROM INAPPROPRIATE DEVELOPMENT

In this case, BRENTWOOD'S DRAFT LOCAL PLAN borders BASILDON and can be classed as urban sprawl as BASILDON COUNCIL have also put forward plans in the BASILDON DRAFT LOCAL PLAN to build on the land that borders BRENTWOOD boundary at Dunton

This development would decimate and therefore have a totally unacceptable impact upon the rural character and appearance of the proposed area and harm the openness of the Green Belt.

THE BRENTWOOD DRAFT LOCAL PLAN does not incorporate a feasible plan as to how you intend to alleviate the extra traffic congestion this new development will generate in the area. Such a huge development will have a catastrophic negative impact on the surrounding roads - the A127 and A128, especially as the proposed area has no road access in place at the present time.

THE INFRASTRUCTURE in the surrounding areas, i.e. schools, hospitals and doctors surgeries are already stretched to capacity and cannot support this development.

I object to the Dunton Development because it would decimate and therefore have a totally unacceptable impact upon the rural character and appearance of the proposed area and harm the openness of the GREEN BELT.
