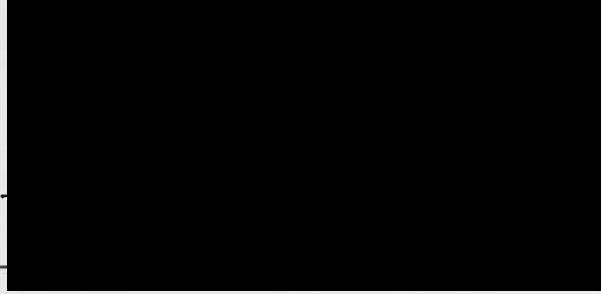

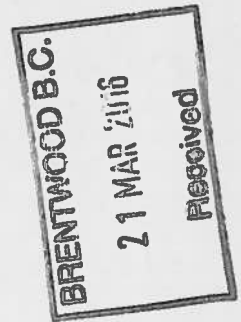
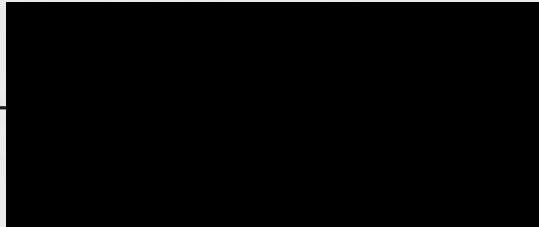

### MULTI-CRITERIA RESPONSE SURVEY DESIGN

The first step in the design process is to identify the criteria that will be used to evaluate the alternatives. These criteria should be relevant to the decision maker and should be measurable. The next step is to develop a questionnaire that will collect data on the criteria for each alternative. The questionnaire should be designed to be easy to complete and should include instructions for respondents.



The data collected from the questionnaire is then analyzed to determine the best alternative. This is typically done by calculating a weighted score for each alternative based on the criteria and their relative importance. The alternative with the highest score is considered the best choice.

Finally, the results of the analysis are presented to the decision maker, who can then make a final decision based on the information provided.

I STRONGLY OBJECT TO BRENTWOOD'S DRAFT LOCAL PLAN REGARDING THE DEVELOPMENT OF GREEN BELT LAND FOR HOUSING AT DUNTON ON LAND THAT BORDERS BASILDON

BECAUSE:

IT CAN BE CLASSED AS URBAN SPRAWL IT WOULD DECIMATE THE RURAL CHARACTER AND APPEARANCE OF THE PROPOSED AREA AND HARM THE OPENESS OF THE GREEN BELT.

IT LACKS A FEASIBLE PLAN OF HOW TO ALLEVIATE THE EXTRA TRAFFIC THIS NEW DEVELOPMENT WILL GENERATE. SUCH A HUGE NEGATIVE IMPACT ON THE SURROUNDING ROADS - THE A127 and A128 - already congested with heavy traffic.

THE INFRASTRUCTURE in the surrounding area - doctors, hospital, schools, transport - is already stretched to capacity and cannot support this development.

Destroying GREEN BELT at Dunton is totally unacceptable. Your housing estate should be built closer to Brentwood centre, where the infrastructure can sustain it.
