

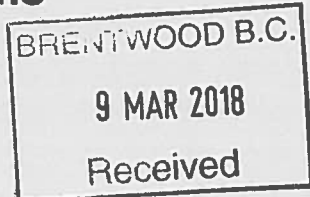

1. Poor doctor's service, we have to wait two weeks for a normal appointment, if we are lucky. Yet there are days when missing the surgery, I am the only patient in the waiting room^{xx}. Therefore 25 new homes in Hook End with a minimum of 45 extra patients can only make the situation much worse. AS WE HAVE SEVERAL PART TIME DOCTORS
2. Green Belt land was supposed to be sacrosanct never to be built on. This was until Brentwood Council decided it can be used for Building land. One law for most except when it comes to Brentwood Council.
3. 25 new properties fitted into this small piece of land, including an access road, they must be shoe horned in at best. How many of these new houses have been allocated for first time buyers?
4. This means the loss of the only recreation field in the whole of the Hook End area. This in turn deprives young people from taking part in any kind of sporting activity which this vacant field currently provides.
5. Poor police service, can't remember when we last saw a local policeman on foot; on a bike, or even in a car. In this area you would think they do not exist.

6. Traffic levels over the last few years have already increased to an un-acceptable level. In Mill Lane where we live, the traffic between 7.30 and 9.30 AM and again at 4.30-6.30 PM is pretty well continuous and with the additional 20-homes at Hook End, it can only get worse.
7. The existing schools are already full and will potentially 20-additional families, which means more children moving into the school area, how are they going to cope.
8. I am aware that more houses are needed in all areas including Hook End. Surely it is better to use various small infill sites around the general area including Daddingshurst as a better solution.
