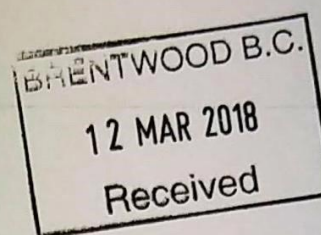

Sirs,

I am finding it hard to understand the building of the development above. The area concerned does not, to my mind, appear suitable. Even laymen, such as myself, can see there are certain factors which will cause problems, not only when finished but in the building of the site as well. The following are but a few:-

The lack of what will be much needed amenities such as, schools & doctors. Bear in mind an extra six to seven hundred people.

Local transport, particularly for the elderly. There has been no mention so far of the access roads which will be needed. I would have thought that would have been the first consideration. There will be an average of three hundred cars needing to use the existing local roads. This will impact on Homesteads estate in a major way as well as other routes in and out. As already mentioned, which nobody has any idea of yet.

The connection between the 'older people's home' and the two hundred houses. A hidden agenda perhaps?

One must question the U-turn by the council from their previous assessments of this site for building purposes.

There is of course leverage from the government for all councils to seek out land for housing, however it would not be prudent, surely, to give later councillors cause to regret decisions made by their predecessors.

Finally there is the question of the Green Belt.
