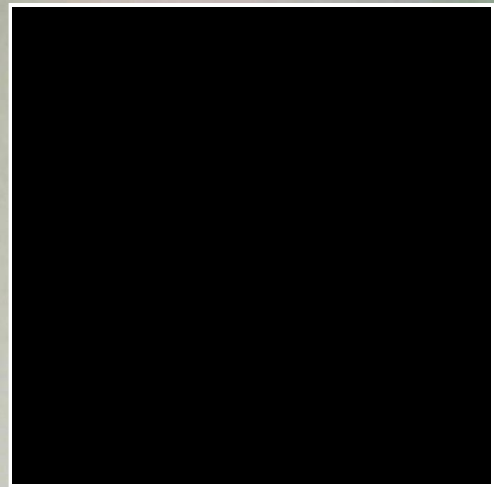
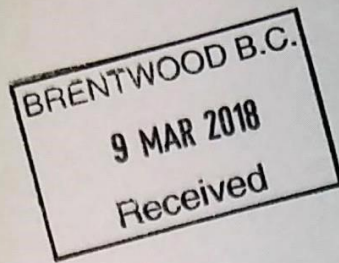

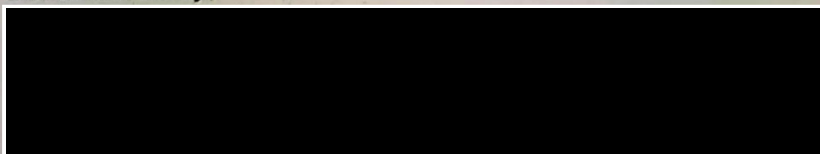


To The Planning Policy Team Brentwood Council,

I am writing to object about the proposed building development in out village.

- i) 96 new homes in this small village is an increase of 28.6% which is far too much for a rural area. This is especially unfair as other parishes in the vicinity are not affected by similar plans
- ii) The proposed buildings will take up Green Belt land. I heard ministers on TV this last weekend dismiss the idea that any building will be on Green Belt land. I am furious that Brentwood is considering getting around the regulations. I have known private citizens who wanted to extend their home a few feet or build a garage that would be 1 foot into Green Belt and were not allowed because of Green restrictions.
- iii) There would also be the loss of valuable agricultural land
- iv) The building of this many house would put too much strain on the infrastructure of the village. Water supply –gas– sewers – communications – drainage (we already have flooding problems)
- v) That many home inevitable means more families. The local school is full already and the Health Centre over stretched.
- vi) Public transport is minimal which means even more cars putting more strain on our country lanes and the minimal parking that we have already.
- vii) The proposal to build on the recreation area at Tipps Cross is extremely detrimental and unfair on the existing community. It would also jeopardise the nearby well used Remembrance Hall.
