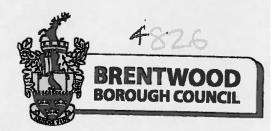

This is currently Green Belt land. The building of the proposed 50 new houses would be totally out of scale with all other developments in Doddinghurstand and would dramatically change the environment for the current residents in this area of the village.

Lime Grove is at present a small, no-through road which is only 4.8m wide, serving 100 homes. There is extensive on-street parking of residents vehicles which has increased markedly in the 20 years we have lived here. On road parking is heavy during "out of office" hours and especially weekends,. The road is very congested with parked cars and access down the road for any delivery vans/lorries or emergency vehicles is very restricted. The waste collection lorry on

| | wednesdays has to regularly drive up the kerbs onto the pavement to pass parked cars (damaging the verges and kerbs in the process), any additional traffic from the proposed development would only exacerbate this problem. The other access to the proposed site, Peartree Lane is little different. Also site access for heavy vehicles during any construction phase would be dangerous to the residents of Lime Grove and Peartree Lane and access would be virtually impossible. | |
